歷史

聖神修院前身是華南總修院(一九三一年至一九六四年),總修院 之興建是為培育華南地區國籍神職人員,讓他們於晉鐸後,服務所 屬教區。華南地區包括韶關、梧州、廣州、江門、嘉應、汕頭、汀 州、廈門、福州、建寧、福寧、北海、瓊縣和香港等教區。

然而,除了香港外,上述各教區,鑑於環境變遷,自一九六四年 後,再沒有派修士到來接受培育。於是,傳信部解散總修院,並將 修院院址交由香港教區使用。是年,香港教區就在總修院院址開辦 教區大修院,即現今的聖神修院,落實了梵蒂岡第二屆大公會議, 有關修士與神職人員該在他們所屬地區接受培育的指示。

一九七零年聖神修院神哲學院成立,由香港教區、澳門教區、耶穌 會和慈幼會合辦,一九八五年再邀得方濟會加入。

一九七三年,學院開始接受信友入讀,使他們有機會強化個人對天主的認識,及成為建設天國的有效工具。

一九七四及七六年,神學部與哲學部先後成為羅馬宗座傳信大學屬校。從此,該兩學部的畢業生可獲頒授神學學士學位(Bachelor of Theology)與哲學學士學位(Bachelor of Philosophy)。

一九八九年,為了滿全信友希望獲得神學課程學位的心願和需要, 學院再向前邁進一步,開辦宗教學部,並同樣地獲得宗座傳信大學 神學院的認可,使凡依照學部要求,修畢所有課程的人士,均可獲 頒授宗教學學士學位(Bachelor in Religious Sciences)。 一九九四年,神學部取得了宗座傳信大學的同意,開始一個為期 兩年的神學碩士學位(教義神學)課程(Licentiate in Theology (Dogmatic Theology) Program)。因此,神學部需要從宗座傳信 大學附屬學院的地位,提升為該大學的成員學院。一九九七年三 月六日,公教教育部終於批准神學部升格的申請,成為宗座傳信 大學神學院的成員學院。

目的

聖神修院神哲學院乃一所專為研究神哲學的學術中心,由三個不同 學部:神學部,哲學部和宗教學部組成。學院的首要目的是為給有 志獻身司鐸職務的人士,教授哲學及神學。其次,為了配合地方教 會發展上的需要,給予平信徒神哲學的訓練。

1. 歴史

聖神修院圖書館是一所專科圖書館,以收藏神學、哲學及宗教學方面的資料為主,作為支援本地神學教育之用。本館於一九六七年正式成立,當時藏書均來自太古樓小修院及華南總修院,以供聖神修院所需;至一九七一年,本館又吸納了公教進行社圖書館藏書,並把服務擴展至聖神修院神哲學院。

2. 發展

聖神修院神哲學院在推動本港教區神、哲學培育方面扮演了一個重 要角色。一九九四年,學院開辦神學碩士課程;同時本館亦進行電 腦化及地方擴展工程以作配合。一九九七年,本館安裝了DYNIX圖書 館電腦系統,在編目、流通及公共目錄方面進行全面電腦化;這系 統亦為本港公共圖書館所用的電腦系統。其後,為提升服務質素, 本館更於二零一四年改用Aleph圖書館電腦系統。這嶄新的系統能讓 讀者更快速地從本館藏書、EIN聯網館藏及網絡世界中搜尋資料。

為提供讀者一個更寬闊及舒適的閱讀環境,本館在一九九八年進行 了地方擴展工程,由原來的一層樓增至目前的三層樓。地下主要存 放中文圖書;二樓收藏外文圖書;而三樓則存放最新年度的期刊。

靠著本身的經費及外來的捐獻,本館藏書量已由一九六七年的六千 冊,增至目前約有八萬三千冊;這包括了三萬三千冊中文圖書及五 萬冊外文圖書。此外,本館每年訂購的期刊約有一百種。

於二零零三年,本館為向各地華人教會提供完備的神學資料,故增 設網上中文資料庫,以方便讀者搜尋教宗及各教廷聖部所頒佈的文 件中文譯本。此外,該網頁更載有多份本館的神學雜誌及神學工具 書的資料。 隨著資訊科技之發展,本館為提高服務質素,故於二零零五年起提 供網上目錄,更於二零一四年改用"Easy Search"系統,以供讀者透 過網上平台搜尋資料、查閱個人借還書記錄、續借及預約書籍和接 收各項電郵通知書。

為提供讀者更方便快捷的服務,本館自二零零五年已開始引入電子 資源。現時本館已訂購九個英文(Cambridge Companions, Cambridge Books Online, Digital Loeb Classical Library, Ebook Central, Gale, iG Library, NetLibrary, Oxford Handbooks Online 及 Religion Online)和三個 中文(Super Book City, iRead ebook 及 HyRead ebook)電子書的資料 庫,四個全文電子雜誌的資料庫(ATLAS PLUS, GALE (Religion, Social Science), GALE (Chinese Recorder) 及 Religion & Philosophy),以及一個 電子論文資料庫(中大宗教與中國社會研究中心論文)。這些資料 庫在神學、哲學和文化上之範疇提供讀者約九萬二千多項書籍及雜 誌。此外,本館更為優化網上目錄,故輸入了部份重要藏書的目錄 和顯示其封面的影像。

3. 教會資訊網

讀者除了使用本館的資訊外,更可透過教會資訊網(EIN),檢索其 線上聯合目錄。此資訊聯網成立於一九九五年,旨在藉著本港不同 宗派機構的合作,促進香港基督宗教的合一,並在這資訊時代裡, 支援神學教育及滿足信徒在神學資訊上的需要。該聯網之成員現時 包括了下列五間神學圖書館:

1. 課程目的

本課程提供教義神學的專研科目,重點是神學本地化問題的探究。

2. 歐洲學分互認體系

由2015-16學年起,本院按照羅馬宗座傳信大學的要求,採用歐洲 學分互認體系(ECTS),並以ECTS學分表示學生的學習量。每1學分 相當於最少25小時的學習(當中包括8小時的授課)。此舉有助教 授和學生客觀地釐定每一科所需的學習時間。

3. 課程結構

這課程是一個兩年制(全時間)或四年制(選讀)的神學碩士學 位課程。學生必須完成126個ECTS學分,其中包括:通修科目14學 分、教義神學科目35學分、選修科目14學分、研習會21學分、及 論文42學分。開辦的科目如下:

備註:

- 研習會LS01A是必修科,而餘下的研習會是選修科。學生必須修畢21個研習會 學分(即:3個研習會)。研習會的基本要求是:每位報讀同學須在講師的指導 下,以英文撰寫一篇6,000字的文章(不包括參考書目在內)。

4. 學年分配

- a. 學年始於九月初而終於次年五月底。第一和第二學期之間的假期 約在聖誕至一月中。
- b. 每節授課時間50分鐘,每3.5個ECTS學分有28節課。每週授課三
 天,時間為每週二、週四晚上七時十五分至九時,及週六下午二
 時半至六時半。必要時,也會安排於其他時間上課。

5. 入學資格

- a. 有良好品格及符合學歷要求的天主教徒,均可申請報讀本神學碩
 士學位課程。特殊情況將由校長成立的入學委員會決定是否接受
 其申請。
- b. 學歷要求:
 - i. 具「榮譽」(cum laude)神學學士學位或同等學歷;
 - ii. 由於本院以中文和英文兩種語言授課,良好的中英文水平是 必須的。
- c. 若申請者沒有神學學士學位,但曾在一所被本地主教認可的修院 或學院完成六年的神哲學訓練,平均成績不少於80分者,均可參 加入學考試。如入學考試成績不少於80分,將會被取錄。申請者 須對聖經希臘文、聖經希伯來文和拉丁文有基礎認識。

6. 一般守則

- a. 報名和重新註冊
 - P生必須於每年開課前完成報名或註冊的手續。為新生來 說,他們須要在招生期間填寫報名表,支付首期學費和確認 課程的日期和時間。為舊生來說,他們須重新註冊,支付學 費和確認選讀的科目。入學及重新註冊均可在學院的網站上 完成。這是學生的責任,以確保他們註冊的學科正確無誤。

神學部 - 神學碩士學位(教義神學)課程

- ii. 沒有報名或註冊的學生將不獲准進入課室,以及無法使用本學院的一切設施。
- iii. 逾期報名或註冊的學生須繳付逾期報名費。
- b. 學生證

凡入學的學生,學院將發給學生證,學生證有效期至課程結 束。如有遺失、學生須繳費才可補領學生證。

- c. 出席和守時
 - Pic需要保存所有學生課堂的出席率,因此班長會請學生在 點名紙上簽到。不論任何理由,若學生缺席次數超過全學期 堂數的百分之二十,有關學生將因不准考試而喪失該科的學 分。
 - ii. 學生須每天檢查他們的電子郵箱及學院的告示板,以免錯過
 修改上課及活動時間的緊急通知。
 - iii. 學生須在限期前交功課,否則會受到處分或因不被接受而要 重修該一學科。
- d. 缺席的通知

學生如有重大的缺席原因,必須通知該科的教授和神學部主 任,如果是患病,學生通常要提供證據。

e. 惡劣天氣安排

颱風、暴雨及極端情況下的上課指引,請參閱附錄乙。

- f. 更改個人資料
 - i. 學生須通知學院祕書處任何學生資料的更改:地址更改(郵 遞和電子郵箱),電話號碼更改(辦公室,住宅和手電), 以及課程的暫停或退出。
 - ii. 學生就讀期間可以在網頁上「我的資料」檢查個人資料是否

正確。任何錯誤的資料必須呈報,因為學院將按這些資料發 出成績單,計算學習進度,以及與學生保持聯繫。為了提高 通訊的效率,學生須提供一個可聯繫的電郵地址,沒有電郵 地址將會導致訊息中斷。

iii. 學院非常重視個人資料的保密。我們必須擁有學生準確而詳細的個人資料,但這些資料只會在特定的情況下才向有關當局披露。

g. 休學

如果學生要暫停學業,他們必須以書面形式向學院神學部主任 查詢,並交回他們的學生證。如果學生要恢復學業,他們必須 不遲於新學年開始前一個月與神學部主任商議。

h. 終止註冊

學生無論因任何原因,在學年結束前決定終止註冊,須事先通 知神學部主任,並交回學生證。

7. 使用生成式人工智能的指引

a. 學院的立場

學院支持使用生成式人工智能(GenAl),並認為它是一個很好的靈感來源。但是,我們要強調:學生提交的任何作業都應該是他們自己的手筆,他們必須對自己所寫的一切負責。由人工智能產生的內容可能不準確、具誤導性或包含受版權保護的資料。學生應該負責任地及明智地使用GenAl。

b. 學生在使用GenAI時應該注意什麼呢?

- c. 學生是否可以使用GenAI工具協助做作業,取決於課程的性質和 學習目標。請參閱相關作業的具體指示,如有疑問請詢問你的 導師。
- d. 如學生被發現違反學術誠信,將受到紀律處分。這些個案將根 據學院既定的紀律程序處理。

8. 論文要求

- a. 學生須按照學院的論文格式,撰寫一篇論文(篇幅:英文約為90 頁雙間隙A4紙,中文為2至3萬字;不包括參考書目在內)。學生 須以英文撰寫論文。若論文主題涉及很多中文原材料,學生或會 被允許以中文撰寫論文。但在這情況下,學生須同時以英文撰寫 一份論文撮要,篇幅約為中文論文的三分一。
- b. 學生須在一位教授指導下預備一份寫作大綱,為論文的題目註 冊。該大綱須説明研究的範圍,採用的方法以及基本的參考書 目。一個由三位教授組成的小組,不包括指導教授在內,將會評 審該論文大綱。獲得通過後,學生便可在指導教授的帶領下,按 該大綱寫作。
- c. 指導教授通過並接受完成的論文後,神學部主任會委派兩位教授 研讀該論文。假若他們接受該論文,學生便可進行公開答辯,日 期通常是每年的5月或12月。學生須於公開答辯前的一個月,將5 份論文副本送交神學部主任。

- d. 公開答辯時,學生須就所寫論文作45分鐘的講解;再另加45分 鐘的口試,回答指導教授及兩位主考教授的提問。歡迎所有教 授及學生出席公開答辯。
- e. 本院以公開論文答辯代替碩士學位畢業總考。

9. 領受神學碩士學位的條件

欲領受神學碩士學位者,必須滿全下列條件:

- a. 在整個課程中,他們該至少獲得126個ECTS學分,科目包括:
 - i. 通修科目(14學分);
 - ii. 教義神學科目(35學分);
 - ⅲ. 選修科目(14學分);
 - iv. 研習會(21學分);
 - v. 論文(42學分);
- b. 領受者每科的績分不得少於60分;
- c. 領受者須按論文要求,完成一篇論文,成績不得少於60分;及
- d. 領受者須在課程期間,掌握以下其中1種語文的閱讀能力:德
 文、法文、意大利文、西班牙文或葡萄牙文。

10. 成績評核、等級和科目豁免

 a. 成績評核的方式一般有兩類,即正式考試和作業。每一科的評 核方式由教授自行決定。每一科是獨立單元,完成後學生可獲 得該科的成績和學分。教授作出最後評分時,他們不單依據正 式考試的成績,而且也參考同學的作業和課堂上的表現。

c. 本課程不設科目豁免。

11. 處理學生紀律問題之程序

如果有人投訴某學生倡議異端邪説和生活不檢點,並且提交了表 面證據,校長便會成立一個紀律委員會調查指控,委員會成員包括 一位教授、神學部主任和作為召集人的校長。校長會把調查結果報 告給香港主教和本院校董會。若指控屬實,便按事件的嚴重性而 定,該學生會被警告、暫停或取消學籍。該學生可向香港主教及羅 馬宗座傳信大學神學院上訴,由傳信大學作最終裁判。

12. 費用

- a. 神學碩士學位(教義神學)課程的學費:
 - i. 2024-25年度之學費為全年港幣19,500元或每3.5個ECTS學分 港幣1,650元。
 - ii. 原則上,每學期的學費是根據學生所修讀的學分之多少來決定;但是,每年所收取的學費均設上限(2024-25年度之上限為港幣19,500元);收費減免將於每年的第二學期處理【即:每年的第一學期學費會根據每位學生在該學期所修讀的學分之多少來計算;若兩學期的學費總額高於每年的上限,則第二學期便只需繳付餘額】。
 - iii. 以2024-25年度之學費計算,全科生的整個課程學費不會超過港幣39,000元;而選讀生則不會超過港幣39,600元。
 - iv. 每學年的學費分兩期支付。
 - ·· 學費包括教學、導修、研習會、參加考試及使用學院設施, 也包括借用圖書館圖書,但不包括課本。
 - vi. 學院將每年檢討學費一次。有關學費的繳交日期及退款原則,請參閱附錄甲。
- b. 申請報讀神學碩士學位(教義神學)課程,學院將不收取任何報
 名費。
- c. 學生如欲報考每年5月或12月舉行的公開論文答辯,須繳交港幣 3,200元考試費和港幣800元證書費。羅馬宗座傳信大學頒發神學 碩士學位的先決條件是成功通過公開論文答辯。收取的證書費將 會送到傳信大學,考試費乃支付學院主持公開論文答辯的行政支 出。如果學生決定不領取傳信大學的學位,他/她無須繳交學位 的考試費和證書費。
- d. 所有費用請以劃線支票支付,支票抬頭為「聖神修院神哲學院」。

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e. 香港教區教友培育基金為報讀本學院課程的平信徒提供獎學金, 申請表可於教區網頁下載。

13. 申請入學

- a. 本學院一般於四月初開始接受申請。申請人可於學院網頁下載報
 名表格。把表格填妥後,連同所需文件(包括:推薦書)寄交祕
 書處。祕書處會通知申請人面試的安排。申請人只有在被錄取
 後,才能辦理註冊手續。
- b. 推薦書:神職人員、修生及修士的推薦書必須由他們長上填寫;
 其他人的推薦書須由神職或修道人填寫。

3. 退款原則

- a. 如果課程無法開辦或撤回,已收取的學費將全部退還。

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History

The origin of Holy Spirit Seminary College of Theology and Philosophy dates back to the early foundation of the Regional Seminary for South China (1931-1964). The purpose of the foundation was the formation of local clergy for the South China District who could then serve in their local dioceses after their priestly ordination. The South China District comprised the dioceses of Shaoguan, Wuzhou, Guangzhou, Jiangmen, Jiaying, Shantou, Dingzhou, Xiamen, Fuzhou, Jianning, Funing, Beihai, Qingxian and Hong Kong.

However, in 1964, when the above dioceses were not sending any of their seminarians for formation, the Congregation of Propaganda Fide closed the Regional Seminary and transferred the premises to the Hong Kong Diocese, which in the same year on the same premises set up its diocesan seminary, naming it "Holy Spirit Seminary," thus implementing the directive of Vatican II that the formation of seminarians and priests should be localized.

In 1970, Holy Spirit Seminary College of Theology & Philosophy was established through the collaboration of the Hong Kong Diocese, the Macau Diocese, the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and the Salesians of Don Bosco. Then in 1985, the Order of the Franciscan Minors was invited to join them.

In order that the laity might have an opportunity to deepen and widen their knowledge of God, since they too can be effective instruments in building God's Kingdom, the Seminary College was opened to the laity in 1973.

The Theology and Philosophy Divisions of the Seminary College were affiliated to the Pontifical Urbaniana University of Rome in 1974 and 1976 respectively; thus making it possible for students taking theology and philosophy to obtain the degrees of Bachelor of Theology and Bachelor of Philosophy. A further step was taken, when in 1989, in order to fulfil the desires and needs of the laity for a degree course in theology, the Seminary College was expanded with the opening of the Higher Institute of Religious Sciences, endorsed by the Faculty of Theology of the Pontifical Urbaniana University. Those who have completed the necessary requirements in this Institute will obtain the degree of Bachelor in Religious Sciences.

In 1994, with the consent of the Pontifical Urbaniana University, the Theology Division started a two-year programme leading to the degree of Licentiate in Theology (L.T.). This required upgrading the status of the Theology Division from that of affiliation to aggregation with respect to the Pontifical Urbaniana University. On March 6th, 1997, the Holy See's Congregation for Catholic Education upgraded the Theology Division, aggregating it to the Theology Faculty of the Pontifical Urbaniana University.

Goals

Holy Spirit Seminary College of Theology and Philosophy is an academic centre consisting of three distinct entities: the Theology Division, the Philosophy Division and the Higher Institute of Religious Sciences. They offer programmes of studies in philosophy and theology. The primary goal of the Seminary College is the teaching of theology and philosophy to men preparing for the ordained ministry. In line with the newly developing needs of the local Church, a secondary goal is the teaching of theology and lay.

1. History

The Holy Spirit Seminary Library is a special library with emphasis on materials of theological, philosophical and religious nature. It serves as an information and resource center to support the theological education and training of priests, religious and the laity. The Library officially came into existence in August 1967. It included books from the Seminary in Tai Koo Lau as well as from the Regional Seminary Library which served the needs of the Holy Spirit Seminary. In 1971, the Library incorporated the books of the Catholic Center Library and extended its service to Holy Spirit Seminary College of Theology and Philosophy.

2. Development

With the increasing demand for theological education for the laity and great interest in the area of theology and religious studies, the Seminary College plays an important role in the Diocese of Hong Kong in developing theological education. With the development of the Seminary College, a postgraduate programme in theology was introduced in 1994. In line with the development of the postgraduate programme, the Library was automated and spatially extended. In 1997, the Dynix automated library system, a system used in the public libraries in Hong Kong, was installed. In 2014, with a view to upgrading our library system and improving the library services in this fast-changing world of technology, a new library system called "Aleph" was installed. This system enables users to have a faster and easier access to our Library's collections, the EIN consortium's collections and the Internet information world. The Library is now fully automated in the areas of cataloguing, circulation and public online catalogue.

The Holy Spirit Seminary Library has been renovated and extended to occupy also the first and second floors of the existing building, and providing a more spacious and comfortable environment for the users. The ground floor houses extensive collections in Chinese, the first floor contains the Western languages section, and the second floor houses periodicals of the current year. The Library collections have been growing as a result of gifts, endowments and purchase using its subscription funds. In 1967, the collections contained 6,000 volumes in all, but now there is a Chinese section with about 33,000 volumes of books and a Western language collection with about 50,000 volumes. The Library subscribes to around 100 titles of periodicals in different languages.

In 2003, a Chinese database was created on the web to provide theological information in Chinese for Chinese Church communities all over the world. This webpage contains links to a collection of Chinese documents promulgated by the Popes and the Sacred Congregations of the Roman Curia. Users can also access the full text for a number of Chinese theological journals and reference books of our Library, and perform search via this webpage.

With the advent of computing and information technology, in 2014 our library service was further upgraded with the launch of an online union catalogue called "Easy Search". This web-based catalogue has greatly enhanced user accessibility to the library service, and enables our users to perform a number of essential tasks such as searching the materials, checking their circulation records, renewing and holding items, receiving pre-overdue and overdue e-mail notices etc. via the Internet.

In order to better serve our users in this digital world, our Library has been enhancing our electronic resources since 2005. We have currently subscribed to nine English (Cambridge Companions, Cambridge Books Online, Digital Loeb Classical Library, Ebook Central, Gale, iG Library, NetLibrary, Oxford Handbooks Online and Religion Online), three Chinese (Super Book City, iRead ebook and HyRead ebook) e-book collections, four e-journal collections (ATLAS PLUS, GALE (Religion, Social Science), GALE (Chinese Recorder) and Religion & Philosophy) and one e-theses collection (E-Theses of CUHK's Center of the Study of Religion and Chinese Society). These collections, comprising more than 92,000 titles, in the areas of religion, philosophy and culture, provide reference sources in addition to the existing "conventional" printed books to our users. Moreover, to enhance our web-based catalogue, we have begun to add the table of contents and the book cover images to some of our core materials.

3. Ecumenical Information Network (EIN)

Besides using the information resources in our Library, users can also access the largest theological library catalogue in Hong Kong by searching the union catalogue of the Ecumenical Information Network (EIN). This network was established in March 1995 in Hong Kong. It is a library automation project aimed at contributing to theological education and church unity by networking the Christian religious and theological libraries in Hong Kong. At present, there are five member libraries in the EIN:

- Alliance Bible Seminary Library
- China Graduate School of Theology Library
- Evangelical Seminary Library
- Holy Spirit Seminary Library
- Lutheran Theological Seminary Library

This cooperation facilitates the sharing of library and information resources among EIN member libraries. The EIN union catalogue enables users to search through collections of the participating libraries. The union catalogue includes about 975,300 records and is the largest Chinese theological library catalogue not only in Hong Kong, but also in the world.

1. Goals

To offer instruction in the specialization in Dogmatic or Systematic Theology, with a particular emphasis to investigate the problems of inculturation.

2. European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS)

Since the Academic Year 2015-16, the Seminary College adopts European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) and uses ECTS credits to express the volume of learning of students. 1 ECTS credit corresponds to at least 25 hours of work, which includes 8 hours of lecture. This helps professors and students to objectively determine how much learning time each course needs.

3. Structure

The programme is a licentiate course, of two years of full-time study or four years of part-time study. To complete the programme, students should acquire 126 ECTS credits, including 14 credits from courses common to all specializations, 35 credits from courses proper to Dogmatic Theology, 14 credits from elective courses, 21 credits from seminars and 42 credits from a thesis. Remark:

- Students should acquire 21 credits from seminars (i.e. three seminar courses in total). While one seminar course LS01A is compulsory, the remaining two courses are electives to be chosen from the list of seminar courses available.

For each seminar course, students are required to write a seminar paper (in English of 6,000 words, not including bibliography) under the guidance of the lecturer.

4. Academic Year

- a. The academic year lasts from the beginning of September until the end of May. The break between the semesters is from Christmas to mid-January.
- b. Class periods are of 50 minutes' duration. 28 class periods are equivalent to 3.5 ECTS credits. Classes are held on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 7:15 p.m. to 9 p.m., and on Saturdays from 2:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. If needed, classes may also be arranged on other dates.

5. Entrance Requirements

- a. Admission to the L.T. programme is open to all Catholics, lay or religious, who are marked by their moral conduct and who have the required qualifications; any exception to this norm will be made by the Admissions Committee set up by the Seminary College President.
- b. The required qualifications are the following:
 - i. All applicants must have obtained the Bachelor of Theology degree (cum laude) or equivalent; and
 - ii. A working knowledge of Chinese and English is required as teaching and assignments are done through the medium of these two languages.
- c. For students who have no B.T. degree but who have completed 6 years of philosophy and theology studies in a seminary or other schools approved by the local bishop with an average grade of 24/30, they can be admitted if they obtain a grade of at least 24/30 in the admission examinations. They must also have a basic knowledge of Biblical Greek, Biblical Hebrew and Latin.

6. General Requirements

- a. Enrolment and Re-registration
 - Students must enrol on the programme at the beginning of each year by completing the enrolment or registration process.
 For new students, this involves completing an enrolment form,

paying the first installment of tuition fees and confirming courses on an allocated date and time during the enrolment period. For continuing students, it involves a re-registration procedure by paying the tuition fees and confirming the courses enrolled. Enrolment and re-registration is done online at the Seminary College website. It is the responsibility of students to ensure that they are registered for the correct courses.

- ii. Students who have not enrolled for the year will not receive any teaching and will not be able to access the services and facilities of the Seminary College.
- iii. A late registration fee will apply to students enrolling or registering after the deadline.
- b. Student Card

Students will be issued with student cards by the Seminary College when they have enrolled on the programme. The student cards will be valid for the duration of the programme. A fee is charged for the replacement of lost cards.

- c. Attendance and Punctuality
 - i. The Seminary College requires a record to be kept of student attendance at all timetabled classes. Therefore, class prefects will circulate an attendance sheet and ask students to sign against their names. If more than 20% of the classes in one semester are missed for any reason, the student will not be allowed to sit for the examination of that course and thus will forfeits the credits for that course.
 - ii. Students must check their email accounts and the College's notice board on a daily basis as timetables and events may be revised at short notices.
 - iii. Students are required to hand in their assignments before the deadlines. If they fail to do so, they will be penalized or will have to retake the subject.

d. Notification of Absence

Students must keep their course professor and Director of Theology Division informed of the reason for any significant absences and, in the case of sickness, will normally be required to provide supporting evidence.

e. Adverse Weather Arrangement

Please read the guidelines for resumption/cancellation of classes in times of typhoons, rainstorms and extreme conditions in Appendix B.

- f. Change of Personal Information
 - i. Students must keep the Secretariat at the Seminary College informed of any changes to their student records: address (postal and email), telephone numbers (office, residential and mobile), and course suspension or withdrawal. They can check their current details on-line using 'My Details' during the course of the year and any errors in their records must be reported as the details of these records will be used to issue their Grade Reports, calculate their progresses and for any staff in the Seminary College to contact them.
 - ii. For efficiency in correspondence, students are required to provide an accessible email address. Failure to do so may result in a breakdown of communication.
 - Data Protection is taken very seriously in the Seminary College.
 We have to keep accurate and detailed information about you but this information is only disclosed to relevant authorities under specific circumstances.
- g. Suspension of Study

If students want to suspend their studies, they must inform the Director of Theology Division in writing and return their student cards. Students must advise the Director of Theology Division of their intention to recommence study no later than one month prior to the start of the academic year.

h. Termination of Registration

Students who for any reason decide to terminate their registration before the end of the academic year must give prior notice to the Director of Theology Division and must return their student cards.

7. Guidelines on Use of Generative Artificial Intelligence

a. Position of the College

The College supports the use of generative AI (GenAI) and considers it a good source of inspiration. However, we want to emphasize that whatever students submit for assessment is supposed to be their own original work and they are accountable for their work. Al-generated content may be inaccurate, misleading or may contain copyrighted material. Students should use GenAI responsibly and wisely.

b. General advices for students in using GenAl

- \checkmark Understand the limitations of any AI system you are using
- ✓ Master "Prompt Engineering" because the quality of output correlates with the quality of input
- ✓ Use GenAl for brainstorming only
- ✓ Check for factual accuracy of AI-generated content
- ✓ Properly acknowledge any GenAl assistance in your work

DON'Ts

- × Do NOT ask GenAl software to write your essays
- × Do NOT rely on Al-generated content as the sole source of information
- c. Whether students are allowed to use GenAl tools in completing their assignment depends on the nature and learning objectives of their courses. Please refer to the specific criteria for your assignments and ask your lecturers if in doubt.

d. Students who are found committing academic dishonesty will face disciplinary actions. These cases will be handled in accordance with the College's Student Disciplinary Procedures.

8. Thesis Requirements

- a. Students are required to write a thesis, according to the style set by the Seminary College, of about 20,000 to 30,000 characters in Chinese or 90 A4-sized double-spaced typewritten pages in English, not including the bibliography. Students are to write their theses in English. But in exceptional cases, students may be given permission to write in Chinese if the topic involves a lot of source materials in Chinese. If students are writing their theses in Chinese, they must also write a synopsis of their theses in English in about one-third of the length of the original theses.
- b. To register the title of the thesis, a student must first prepare a short proposal, under the direction of the moderator or director of his or her thesis, explaining the scope of the research, the methodology adopted and a basic working bibliography. A panel of 3 professors, not including the moderator, will then assess this proposal. If approved, the student can then work on the thesis under the direction of the moderator.
- c. After the moderator approves and accepts the completed thesis, the Director of Theology Division will appoint another two professors to read it. If they also accept the thesis, the student can then proceed with the public defence of the thesis which will be held in May or December. The student should submit 5 copies of his or her thesis one month before the public defence.
- d. During the defence, the student should deliver a 45-minute lecture on the topic of the thesis. The student is also expected to answer viva voce for another 45 minutes the questions raised by the moderator and two other examiners. All professors and students are welcome to attend the public defence.
- e. The public defence serves as the comprehensive examination of the L.T. degree programme.

10. Examination, Standards and Course Exemption

a. There are two general categories of assessment, namely, formal examination and assignments. The type of assessment given is determined by the course professor. Each course is an independent unit, for which the student receives a grade and the assigned number of credits. In giving the final grade, professors take into account of not only the formal examination but also the coursework assigned to the students, as well as their performance in class.

c. No course exemption based on prior study will be granted.

11. Student Disciplinary Procedures

Should there be complaints against a student on his or her integrity of doctrine and the probity of life, and with prima facie evidence submitted, the Seminary College President will set up a sub-committee of three members: one professor, the Director of Theology Division and the President (as the convener), to investigate the allegations. He would report the result of the investigation to the Bishop of Hong Kong and the Seminary College Board. If the allegations are substantiated, the student may be warned or be suspended or even be removed from the Seminary College, depending on the severity of the case. The student may appeal to the Bishop of Hong Kong and finally to the Faculty of Theology of Pontifical Urbaniana University, the decision of which will be final.

12. Fees

- a. Tuition Fee
 - i. The tuition fee for the Academic Year 2024-25 is HK\$19,500 per year or HK\$1,650 per 3.5 ECTS credits. In principle, the amount to be paid is based on the number of enrolled credits. However, the annual tuition fee to be paid for all students is capped at HK\$19,500 per year. The adjustment will be made in the second semester of each year (i.e. In the first semester, a student will pay according to the number of credits he/she has enrolled for. In the second semester, if the amount to be paid exceeds the ceiling, he/she will only need to pay the balance). Therefore, for full-time students, the total tuition fee is not more than HK\$39,000; for part-time students, the total tuition fee is not more than HK\$39,000. The fee is payable in installments; two installments per year.
 - ii. The tuition fee covers instruction, tutorials, workshops, examinations and access to the Seminary College's facilities, including the borrowing of books from the Library, but do not cover textbooks.
 - iii. Tuition fee is subject to an annual review. For the payment schedule and refund policy, please see Appendix A.
- b. The Seminary College does not charge any application fees upon application to the L.T. programme.
- c. A student will pay a final examination fee of HK\$3,200 and a diploma fee of HK\$800 when he/she applies for the public defence of his/her thesis in May or December each year. Successful completion of this examination is a pre-requisite for the granting of the L.T. degree by Pontifical Urbaniana University. Please note that the diploma fee is sent to Pontifical Urbaniana University while the final examination fees paid to the Seminary College are solely used for the administration of the public defence held in the Seminary College. If a student decides not to take the degree from Pontifical Urbaniana University, then he/ she does not have to pay the diploma and final examination fees.

- d. Fees should be paid in the form of a crossed cheque made payable to "Holy Spirit Seminary College of Theology and Philosophy".
- e. Scholarships offered by the Laity Formation Fund of the Hong Kong Diocese may be awarded to lay people who wish to study in the Seminary College. Application forms can be downloaded from the website of the Diocese.

13. Enrolment Procedures

- a. The Seminary College usually accepts new applications starting from early April. Applicants should first download an application form from the website of the Seminary College. After filling in the form, they should send it to the Secretariat together with relevant documents (including a letter of recommendation). The Secretariat will inform the applicants of the schedule for the admission interview. Only after the interview, when it has been determined that the applicant may be admitted, will the applicant be able to proceed with the registration.
- b. Recommendation Letter: for clergy, seminarians and Religious, this is to be given by their own Ordinary, Hierarch or Superior, or by one person delegated by them; for all other people, by some Church persons.

2. Payment Schedule (Part-time)

3. Refund Policy

- a. All tuition fees will be fully refunded if the course is withdrawn or not offered.
- b. On premature cessation of the course, all fees and charges that have been collected in respect of any part of the course failing to be conducted on or after that date of the cessation will be refunded within one month of the premature cessation.
- c. In exceptional hardship cases such as serious illness, disability, death of the students or a close family member (parent, sibling, spouse or child), depending on the nature of the hardship, there will either be a refund of paid tuition fee covering the unattended part of the course or a transfer/defer of study to some other time. Valid proof should be provided by the students.
- d. Students who are granted leave of absence are not required to pay the tuition fees for the period concerned.
